Voucher DISTRIBUTION

June 1 to Sept 30, 2024 at locations throughout York County (see schedule), OR while supplies last.

Voucher REDEMPTION:

At any participating Farmers Market in PA, June 1 thru November 30, 2024. Produce must be grown in PA.

Seniors living in nursing homes, personal care homes, or any residential facility where meals are provided are not eligible to receive vouchers.
